Requirements for admission:

Students can access the Master's degree in International Relations provided they hold a three-year university degree in the classes L-16, L-36 or any equivalent and have a knowledge of English which is at CEFR B2 level or above. This language requirement is mandatory considering that the educational activities and course work will be entirely in English.

General aims

The course aims at training facilitators of business internationalization processes working in enterprises, non-profit institutions, NGOs and public institutions as well as professionals who can interpret the international situation with regard to specific situations and local realities with a view to developing the internationalization processes of public and private institutions and businesses.

Specific aims

The master's degree in International Relations aims at training specialists able to critically analyze political systems, the relationships between countries, geopolitical areas, reasons for tensions and conflicts, ways towards conflict resolution, the role of international organizations, including the EU.

Career opportunities

Alongside traditional job opportunities in diplomacy, governmental and non-governmental organizations, other employment options include public and private companies, international institutions and organizations, including those operating in the banking and financial sector, as well as public administration at a central and local level, which require a wide knowledge of the internationalist dimension of problems and solutions (eg. in the field of environmental protection, of immigration, public procurement etc.). More job opportunities can be identified in counseling and advisory roles at companies and law firms in the commercial sector, overseas investment and commercial arbitration
